



EPSON TOUR: CASINO DEL SOL GOLF CLASSIC

Sewailo Golf Club will host the Epson Tour with a “Road to the LPGA” tournament from May 2nd – 4th! A 132-player field will compete in a 54-hole stroke play format with a cut to the low 60 players and ties after 36 holes. The purse is a total of \$250,000 with a winner’s share of \$37,500. There is an international draw to the

Epson Tour with players from more than 40 countries. Spectators will be allowed to attend the event free of charge. In 2023, Gigi Stoll won the event firing 14-under par with rounds of 69-67-70-68.

AERIFICATION

The greens will be aerified on Monday, May 20th. Aerification is a short-term disruption that has long-term benefits for the golf course. Aerification achieves three important objectives. It relieves soil compaction, it provides a method to improve the soil mixture around the highest part of a green’s roots, and it reduces or prevents the accumulation of excess thatch. Greens typically will heal back in two weeks.

HOLE IN ONE

On Monday, January 29th, Debbie Waitkus aced hole #13 with a 4 hybrid from 131 yards.

GOLF TIP: CHIPPING FROM TIGHT LIES

A good set up will help you with chipping from a tight lie. Grip down on the club for more control and stand closer to the ball. The shaft will be more upright at address, the heel off of the ground, and the toe will be interacting with

the turf. Your club shaft at address will be straighter up and down. You will not want excessive forward shaft lean to make the club dig. Club face will be slightly open. Weight will be more on your front foot. Ball position can be slightly back of center for more roll or in the center of

your stance for less roll. Swing your arms and shoulders. There should be minimal wrists involved. Hit down on the ball and do not try to help the ball up. You have club options for this shot. May want to consider less loft including a pitching wedge, 9, 8, or 7 iron.
